The academic curriculum offers diverse course offerings including opportunities to concurrently enroll in CTE and AP courses on district comprehensive sites or concurrent enroll at Shasta College. Shasta Collegiate Academy offers college preparatory courses and some Advanced Placement courses.

Transcript / Grading

Four-point system grade point average:

Transcript notations: (p) in course code indicates college prep course; (*) in course code indicates non-academic class, not included in academic GPA. (+) in course code indicates honors and is weighted in academic GPA.

Final transcripts include weighted and non-weighted cumulative GPAs. (AP) Advanced Placement courses are

weighted GPA. Student ranking is based on decile and is based on 9-12 weighted total GPA.

2019-2020 and 2020-2021 Grading Instruction

SCA went to 100% distance learning in April of 2020, for 50% of spring semester. Spring 2020, grades were credit/no credit.

2020-2021 SCA was 100% distance learning until March 2021, when students had a choice to return in a hybrid format or stay in distance learning for 50% of spring semester 2021. In 2020-2021, all students were given letter grades for all classes both semesters.

In August 2021, in accordance with California AB 104, families were given the option of choosing to change any or all grades from 2020-2021 to pass / no pass. A grade of D- or higher could be changed to pass.

2021-2022 SCA returned to fully in person instruction.
